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## DETAILS

<b>Method</b>	Knitting
<b>Skill Level</b>	Intermediate
<b>Needles</b>	Circular Knitting Needles 4 mm / US 6, 16" Double Pointed Needles 4 mm / US 6
<b>Notions</b>	Stitch marker Tapestry needle Row counter
<b>Yarn</b>	Debbie Bliss Rialto 4ply, shade 22028 Tangerine, 1 x 50g ball
<b>Gauge</b>	10x10 cms (4" x 4")= 22 sts x 40 rows 4mm needle, stocking st
<b>Instructions</b>	Written format.
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## ABBREVIATIONS

<b>k</b>	knit
<b>p</b>	purl
<b>k2tog</b>	knit two stitches together
<b>k1bl</b>	knit one stitch through the back of the loop
<b>yo</b>	yarn over
<b>sl1</b>	slip one stitch
<b>pss0</b>	pass the slipped stitch over the stitch just knitted
<b>m1</b>	make 1 st by picking up the strand of yarn between the two sts and knitting it through the back loop
<b>pm</b>	place marker
<b>cm</b>	centimeters
<b>rnd(s)</b>	round(s)
<b>st(s)</b>	stitches
<b>meas</b>	measures

# PATTERN

**Note:** *This hat is worked in the round, from the bottom up. Please be aware that the st count will change during the main pattern.*

*Directions are for women's size Medium. This hat can be knitted slouchy (pictured in reference section) or more fitted. Numerals in brackets are for the slouchier version.*

## 1. BRIM

Using 4mm (US 6) circular needle cast on 97 sts, pm and join in the rnd being careful not to twist sts.

**Rnd 1:** \* k1, p1, rep from \* to last st, k1

**Rnd 2:** \* p1, k1, rep from \* to last st, p1

Rep Rnds 1-2 until work meas 3cm

**Next rnd:** \* k3, m1, rep from \* to last four sts, k4.  
128 sts

## 2. PATTERNING

**Rnd 1:** \* yo, k1tbl, yo, sl 1, k1, pssso, k5, rep from \* to end. 144 sts

**Rnd 2:** \* k3, k2tog, k4, rep from \* to end. 128 sts

**Rnd 3:** \* yo, k1tbl, yo, k2, sl 1, k1, pssso, k3, rep from \* to end. 144 sts

**Rnd 4:** \* k5, k2tog, k2, rep from \* to end. 128 sts

**Rnd 5:** \* k1tbl, yo, k4, sl 1, k1, pssso, k1, yo, rep from \* to end. 144 sts

**Rnd 6:** \* k6, k2tog, k1, rep from \* to end. 128 sts

**Rnd 7:** \* k5, k2tog, yo, k1tbl, yo, rep from \* to end. 144 sts

**Rnd 8:** \* k4, k2tog, k3, rep from \* to end. 128 sts

**Rnd 9:** \* k3, k2tog, k2, yo, k1tbl, yo, rep from \* to end. 144 sts

**Rnd 10:** \* k2, k2tog, k5, rep from \* to end. 128 sts

**Rnd 11:** \* yo, k1, k2tog, k4, yo, k1tbl, rep from \* to end. 144 sts

**Rnd 12:** \* k6, k2tog, k1, rep from \* to end. 128 sts

Rep Rnds 1-12 of patterning section 4 (5) times in total. Work should meas 16.5 (21) cm / 6.5" (8")

## 3. DECREASING THE CROWN

**Note:** Switch to double pointed needles when you've decreased to too few stitches to be comfortable on the circular needle.

**Rnd 1:** \* k1tbl, yo, sl 1, k1, pssso, k5, rep from \* to end

**Rnd 2:** \* k2, k2tog, k4, rep from \* to end. 112 sts

**Rnd 3:** \* k1tbl, yo, k1, sl 1, k1, pssso, k3, rep from \* to end

**Rnd 4:** \* k3, k2tog, k2, rep from \* to end. 96 sts

**Rnd 5:** \* k1tbl, yo, k2, sl 1, k1, pssso, k1, rep from \* to end

**Rnd 6:** \* k4, k2tog, rep from \* to end. 80 sts

**Rnd 7:** \* k1tbl, yo, k2, k2tog, rep from \* to end

**Rnd 8:** \* k3, k2tog, rep from \* to end. 64 sts

**Rnd 9:** \* k1tbl, yo, k1, k2tog, rep from \* to end

**Rnd 10:** \* k2, k2tog, rep from \* to end. 48 sts

**Rnd 11:** \* k1tbl, yo, k2tog, rep from \* to end

**Rnd 12:** \* k1, k2tog, rep from \* to end. 32 sts

**Rnd 13:** \* k2tog, rep from \* to end. 16 sts

**Rnd 14:** \* k2tog, rep from \* to end. 8 sts

## 4. FINISH

Cut yarn and draw through rem 8 sts.

Pull tight and weave in loose ends.

Block lightly to open up patt section if desired.

Sew two buttons securely on to front.

## REFERENCE PHOTOS



Hyades is a bright cluster of stars named after the five daughters of Atlas, and often associated with rain. I designed this beret to add some colour to those wet summer afternoons we get in the UK!



Hyades is a lace work beret hat which can be slouchy or fitted. The slouchy version is shown above. Please follow the section of the pattern in brackets to extend the length of the beret for the slouchy version.



Make sure your buttons are not too heavy. With such a fine yarn, a heavy button will drag the hat down and cause the brim to sag. Try not to use wood or metal.
