

# langstaff road hat

My grandparents had a farm on Langstaff Road where I loved to spend time as a child. There were many split rail fences to climb and sit on, visiting with horses. This stitch reminds me of that terrain.

This textured stitch is easy to memorize and is a different twist on the traditional basketweave stitch. It knits up quickly and is a good stepping stone pattern for beginners.

This hat is knit from the bottom to the crown with a full worsted or aran weight yarn. This hat has one size and no visible seam.

### The Technical Stuff



Skill Level:

Rookie-Apprentice-Virtuoso-Genius

Skills: knit, purl

Sizes: adult medium

**Finished Measurements:** 

approx 24 cm wide and 21.5 cm tall lying flat;

fits a 56 cm head

Gauge:

approx 18 sts = 10 cm in St st on 5 mm as

given on Miski ball band

approx 22 sts and 30 rows = 10 cm in langstaff

road patt on 5 mm

Yarn: worsted/aran weight wool

Suggested Brand:

2 skeins Mirasol Miski 100% baby llama 75 m per 50 g

shown in colour 138 wild seaweed (blue) and

110 brownish gray

or 1 skein Malabrigo Twist

100% merino wool

137 m per 100 g

Needles:

4 mm 40 cm circs

5 mm 40 cm circs

5 mm dpns

or size needed to obtain gauge

Other Materials: tapestry needle or teeny

crochet hook; stitch marker

Sizes: adult medium

**Finished Measurements:** 

approx 9.5" wide and 8.5" tall lying flat; fits a 22"

head

Gauge:

approx 18 sts = 4" in St st on US 8 as given on

Miski ball band

approx 22 sts and 30 rows = 4" in langstaff road

patt on US 8

Yarn: worsted/aran weight wool

Suggested Brand:

2 skeins Mirasol Miski

100% baby llama

82 yds per 1.75 oz

shown in color 138 wild seaweed (blue) and 110

brownish gray

or 1 skein Malabrigo Twist

100% merino wool

150 yds per 3.5 oz

Needles:

US 6 16" circs

US 8 16" circs

US 8 dpns

or size needed to obtain gauge

Other Materials: tapestry needle or teeny

crochet hook; stitch marker



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#### Instructions:

Beginning at bottom with smaller circs CO 100 sts (or a multiple of 10 and 4 - ex 80 sts - for the regular rib brim or 10 for the twisted rib brim) with long-tail method.

Join in the rnd being careful not to twist sts. Pm for beg of rnd. SI m throughout.

#### Regular Rib Brim:

K2, P2 for 3.5 cm/1.5" (approx 10 rnds).

#### Twisted Rib Brim (shown):

P1, K1 tbl for 3.5 cm/1.5" (approx 10 rnds).

Change to larger circs and begin Langstaff Road Patt below.

#### Langstaff Road Pattern

Rnd 1: \*K5, (K1tbl, P1) twice, K1tbl\*, rep from \* to \* to end of rnd.

Rnd 2: \*P5, (K1tbl, P1) twice, K1tbl\*, rep from \* to \* to end of rnd.

Rep these 2 rnds twice more.

Rnd 7: \*(K1tbl, P1) twice, K1tbl, K5, \*, rep from \* to \* to end of rnd.

Rnd 8: \*(K1tbl, P1) twice, K1tbl, P5, \*, rep from \* to \* to end of rnd.

Rep these 2 rnds twice more.

Rep Rnds 1-12 of patt once more and then Rnds 1-6 once more. Hat should measure approx 14 cm/5.5" from CO.

If your hat does not reach this measurement or you would like a different length, rep the patt until hat reaches desired length - decs can be started on any rnd of the patt.

#### Decs:

Change to dpns when sts become too tight on circs. 10 sts decreased every other rnd.

Rnd 1: \*Work 8 sts in patt, K2tog\*, rep from \* to \* to end of rnd. 90 sts rem.

Rnd 2 (and all even rnds): \*Work 8 sts in patt, K1\*, rep from \* to \* to end of rnd.

Rnd 3: \*Work 7 sts in patt, K2tog\*, rep from \* to \* to end of rnd. 80 sts rem.

Rnd 5: \*Work 6 sts in patt, K2tog\*, rep from \* to \* to end of rnd. 70 sts rem.

Rnd 7: \*Work 5 sts in patt, K2tog\*, rep from \* to \* to end of rnd. 60 sts rem.

Rnd 9: \*Work 4 sts in patt, K2tog\*, rep from \* to \* to end of rnd. 50 sts rem.

Rnd 11: \*Work 3 sts in patt, K2tog\*, rep from \* to \* to end of rnd. 40 sts rem.

Rnd 13: \*Work 2 sts in patt, K2tog\*, rep from \* to \* to end of rnd. 30 sts rem.

Rnd 15: \*Work 1 st in patt, K2tog\*, rep from \* to \* to end of rnd. 20 sts rem.

Rnd 17: K2tog to end of rnd. 10 sts rem.

Tie off and weave in ends.
