

# escarpment cowl

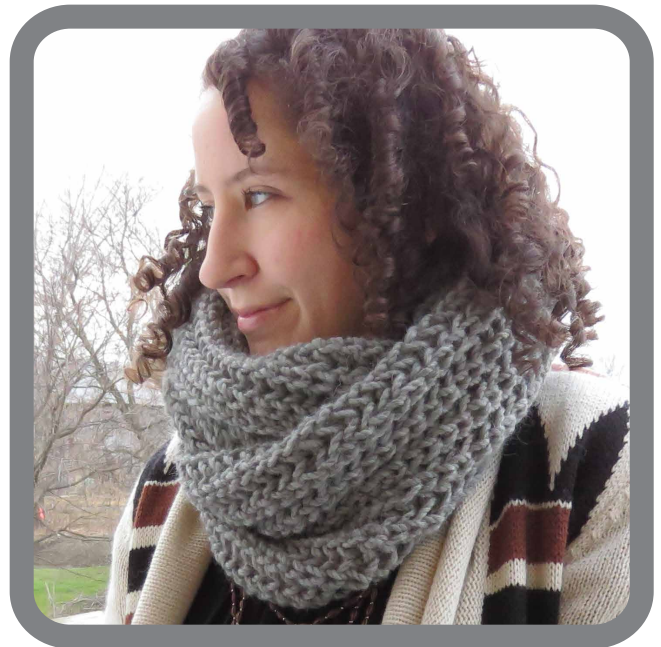


# escarpment cowl

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Cuddle up in this snuggly, cozy cowl. It knits up in no time using a bulky fisherman's rib, which is a cousin of the brioche stitch. It looks great with any outfit. The fabric is stretchy and mushy making it extra comfy.

This cowl is knit flat using a provisional cast on - the ends are then grafted together. Stitches are slipped at the sides making a soft edge and clean lines. This cowl has one size and has a slightly visible seam.

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## The Technical Stuff



### Skill Level:

Rookie-Apprentice-Virtuoso-Genius

**Skills:** knit, purl, K1below (instructions given), provisional cast on, three needle bind off *or* grafting (Kitchener stitch)

**Sizes:** one size

### Finished Measurements:

approx 31 cm wide and 76 cm folded in half lying flat (152 cm long)

### Gauge:

approx 14 sts and 21 rows = 10 cm in St st on 6 mm as given on Berocco *Ultra Alpaca Chunky* ball band

approx 11 sts and 16 rows = 10 cm in pattern stitch

**Yarn:** bulky alpaca-wool blend

### Suggested Brand:

2 skeins Berocco *Ultra Alpaca Chunky*  
50% alpaca, 50% wool  
120 m per 100 g  
shown in colour 7206 Light Gray

+ small amount of bulky yarn in CC for CO

### Needles:

8 mm straight or circular  
extra 8 mm needle of any kind for 3-needle BO  
large crochet hook for provisional CO

*or size needed to obtain gauge*

**Other Materials:** tapestry needle or crochet hook



### Skill Level:

Rookie-Apprentice-Virtuoso-Genius

**Skills:** knit, purl, K1below (instructions given), provisional cast on, three needle bind off *or* grafting (Kitchener stitch)

**Sizes:** one size

### Finished Measurements:

approx 12" wide and 30" folded in half lying flat (60" long)

### Gauge:

approx 14 sts and 21 rows = 4" in St st on US 10 as given on Berocco *Ultra Alpaca Chunky* ball band

approx 11 sts and 16 rows = 4" in pattern stitch

**Yarn:** bulky alpaca-wool blend

### Suggested Brand:

2 skeins Berocco *Ultra Alpaca Chunky*  
50% alpaca, 50% wool  
130 yds per 3.5 oz  
shown in color 7206 Light Gray

+ small amount of bulky yarn in CC for CO

### Needles:

US 11 straight or circular  
extra US 11 needle of any kind for 3-needle BO  
large crochet hook for provisional CO

*or size needed to obtain gauge*

**Other Materials:** tapestry needle or crochet hook



## Stitches:

### K1b = Knit one below

Insert your needle one row below the next st. It should look like a purl is facing you on the next st - insert your needle under this purl. When you move the stitch off the left needle, you should see the stitch "drop" to the next row and then sit there. This helps open up the fabric.



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## Instructions:

With scrap yarn CO 30 sts with provisional method.

Cut scrap yarn. Attach main yarn.

**Row 1:** Knit.

**Row 2:** Sl 1 kwise, knit to last st, purl.

**Row 3:** Slip 1 kwise, \*K1, K1b\*, rep from \* to \* to last st, P1.

Rep Row 3 only until your cowl measures 152 cm/60" from CO.

## Finishing:

Undo sts from provisional CO and place on your spare 8 mm needle. Make sure the cowl is lying flat with no twists, folded in half.

You can either loosely graft/Kitchener stitch the sts together or use a three-needle bind off; for a less visible seam, try grafting in rib (see Resources for extra help). Weave in ends.

- ssk** = slip, slip, knit two slipped stitches together (decrease)
- sssk** = slip, slip, slip, knit all slipped stitches together (double decrease)
- st(s)** = stitche(s)
- St st** = stockinette stitch / stocking stitch
- tbl** = through back loops
- tog** = together
- WS** = wrong side
- wyib** = with yarn in back
- wyif** = with yarn in front
- YO** = yarn over
