Herringbone Wall Hanging by The Blue Mouse

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FREE PATTERN





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Materials

- US Size 15 (10mm) needles
 - I use circular needles because of the amount of stitches, but you can use straight needles
- Bulky (5) weight yarn (I used Yarnspirations Bernat Maker Home Dec)
 - Color A: Approx. 300 yards
 - Color B: Approx. 30 yards
- Yarn Needle
- A piece of driftwood, a wooden rung or some other kind of rod to hang your knit from

Measurements

- 17.25" wide
- 18.5" tall

Gauge (Herringbone)

- -22 sts = 4"
- -15 rows = 4"

Abbreviations

- K = Knit
- P2TOG = Purl 2 together
- SL1 = Slip 1
- PSSO = Pass Slipped Stitch Over
- CO = Cast on
- BO = Bind Off
- RS/WS = Right Side / Wrong Side
- LH/RH = Left hand/ Right hand (needle)
- " = inches

Herringbone Wall Hanging

- With Color A CO 96
 - (I prefer the long tail cast on, but use whatever you're comfortable with)
- Row 1 (RS): K1, *SL1, K1, PSSO and put it on the LH needle instead of dropping it & knit into the back loop of it and then drop it off the needle normally. Repeat from * to the last stitch: K1
- Row 2 (WS): *P2TOG but don't drop the stitches off the LH needle yet, instead place the RH needle in between the two stitches on the LH needle and work the first stitch (closest to the edge) again (purling it regularly), then drop both stitches off normally. Repeat from * to the end of the row.
- Repeat rows 1 & 2 for a total of 20 rows (ending on a row 2 repeat)
- Row 21 (RS): Switch to Color B & repeat row 1
- Row 22 (WS): Switch to Color A & repeat row 2
- Row 23: Switch to Color B & repeat row 1
- Row 24: Switch to Color A & repeat row 2
- **Row 25**: Switch to Color B & repeat row 1
- Row 26: Switch to Color A & repeat row 2
- Row 27: Switch to Color B & repeat row 1
- Row 28: Switch to Color A (you only be using this color for the rest of the project) & repeat row 2
- **Row 29 (RS):** Repeat row 1
- **Row 30 (WS):** Repeat row 2
- Repeat rows 29 & 30 until you finish row 70
- **BO and leave a long tail** (I left several feet of yarn because I wanted to have loose loops around the piece of driftwood I hung it from).
- Thread the tail through a tapestry needle and thread it around what you're hanging it on, then through one of your BO stitches and around the piece of wood again. Keep doing this, only threading through every couple of BO stitches (so you skip some between) until you have completely connected it to whatever you're hanging it from.
- Weave in the ends, hang up and enjoy!
