

This hat has some sweet but simple details: a picot brim, eyelets and a lacey crown. Choose from a slouchy style or a beanie!

The picot brim is made with a provisional cast on which is then folded up and knit together. There is also an option for a "no-sew" picot brim that uses a regular cast on, or if you prefer, you can make a traditional rolled or ribbed brim.

This hat is knit from the bottom to the crown with a worsted weight yarn. This hat has one size (with instructions to adjust) and a slightly visible seam.

The Technical Stuff





Skill Level:

Rookie-Apprentice-Virtuoso-Genius

Skills: knit, purl, provisional cast on (optional)

Sizes: adult medium

Finished Measurements:

approx 26 cm wide and 23 cm tall lying flat for slouch style, 17 cm tall for a beanie style; fits approx a 56 cm head

Gauge:

approx 18 sts = 10 cm in St st on 5 mm as given on Malabrigo ball band

approx 18 sts and 36 rows = 10 cm in antelope patt on 5 mm after gentle blocking

Yarn: worsted merino wool

Suggested Brand:

1 skein Malabrigo *Merino Worsted*100% merino wool
192 m per 100 g
shown in colour 63 natural *Note:* this yarn is listed as an aran weight, but worsted is suggested

Needles:

4 mm 40 cm circs

5 mm 40 cm circs

5 mm dpns

3.5 mm-4 mm spare 40 cm circs (for provisional cast on)

4 mm crochet hook (for provisional cast on) or size needed to obtain gauge

Other Materials: tapestry needle or teeny crochet hook; stitch marker; scrap yarn (for provisional cast on)

Skill Level:

Rookie-Apprentice-Virtuoso-Genius

Skills: knit, purl, provisional cast on (optional)

Sizes: adult medium

Finished Measurements:

approx 10" wide and 9" tall lying flat for slouch style, 6.5" tall for beanie style; fits approx a 22" head

Gauge:

approx 18 sts = 4" in St st on US 8 as given on Malabrigo ball band

approx 18 sts and 36 rows = 4" in antelope patt on US 8 after gentle blocking

Yarn: worsted merino wool

Suggested Brand:

1 skein Malabrigo *Merino Worsted*100% merino wool
210 yds per 3.5 oz
shown in color 63 natural *Note:* this yarn is listed as an aran weight, but worsted is suggested

Needles:

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US 6 16" circs US 8 16" circs US 8 dpns

US 4-6 spare 16" circs (for provisional cast on) US 6 crochet hook (for provisional cast on) or size needed to obtain gauge

Other Materials: tapestry needle or teeny crochet hook; stitch marker; scrap yarn (for provisional cast on)

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Instructions:

Picot Brim

Beginning at bottom with smaller circs and crochet hook, CO 88 sts (or a multiple of 8) with provisional method and scrap yarn (see Resources on page 4 for more help).

Note: If you do not wish to use the provisional method, CO sts with backwards loop method. Join in the rnd being careful not to twist sts. Pm for beg of rnd. SI m throughout. Knit one rnd and continue with Rnd 2, etc below.

Rnd 1: Beginning where the chains are from the provisional CO, attach main yarn and knit to end. Join in the rnd, being careful not to twist sts. Pm for beg of rnd. SI m throughout.

Rnds 2-4: Knit.

Rnd 5 (eyelet rnd): *YO, K2tog*, rep from * to * to end of rnd.

Note: Make sure your first YO remains at the beg of the rnd and doesn't "float" over to the end of the rnd.

Rnd 6-9: Knit.

Next: Undo provisional CO and place sts on spare circs. Fold up the CO edge to the inside and hold it parallel with the front needles. Knit together the st from the front needle and the st from the CO edge (behind) to the end of the rnd.

Note: For a "no-sew" brim, fold the CO edge to the inside. *Insert your needle into the next st on the needle tbl, pick up the corresponding purl st from the WS of the CO edge and knit together with the st on the needle. K1*. Rep from * to * to end of rnd, picking up and knitting together every other st from the CO edge.

Rolled or Ribbed Brim

Beginning at bottom with smaller circs CO 88 sts (or a multiple of 8) with long-tail method.

Join in the rnd being careful not to twist sts. Pm for beg of rnd. SI m throughout.

For a rolled brim knit 8 rnds.

For a ribbed brim K2, P2 for 6 rnds.

Note: You may also wish to work a K1tbl, P1 rib, or a simple K1, P1 ribbed brim. All styles look great with this hat! See Ravelry projects for more examples.

All styles

Work a K1, P1 rib for 4 rnds. Change to larger circs.

Antelope Pattern

Rnd 1: Purl. Rnd 2-4: Knit. Rnd 5: Purl.

Rnd 6 (eyelet rnd): *YO, K2tog*, rep from * to * to

end of rnd.

Rnd 7: Purl.

Rnd 8-13: Rep Rnds 2-7.

Rnds 14-16: Knit.

Rep these 16 rnds once more for a beanie style (or to desired depth) and twice more for a slouch style (or more!).

Note: The sample shown was made with four reps total ending with a Rnd 14.



antelope hat

Dec Rnds:

Note: Change to dpns when sts become too tight on circs.

Rnd 1: *K5, K3tog, YO*, rep from * to * to end of rnd

Rnd 2 (and all even rnds): Knit.

Rnd 3: *K4, K3tog, YO*, rep from * to * to end of rnd

Rnd 5: *K3, K3tog, YO*, rep from * to * to end of rnd.

Rnd 7: *K2, K3tog, YO*, rep from * to * to end of rnd.

Rnd 9: *K1, K3tog, YO*, rep from * to * to end of rnd.

Rnd 11: *K3tog, YO*, rep from * to * to end of rnd.

Rnd 13: K2tog to end of rnd.

Cut yarn. Pull through rem sts and tie off. Weave in ends.



Gently block the hat by spraying it with water and either steam blocking it with an iron or laying it flat to dry.
