FANCY Yet Easy Ornament

Small amounts of sparkling metallic yarn, or leftover sock yarn can be used to quickly knit up this dainty round motif. This smaller version of the popular dishcloth design can be used for a holiday tree decoration or as a small doily.



Materials

Sparkly, metallic, or variegated sport weight yarns. Sample knit in Plymouth Yarns 24K (82% Nylon, 18% lame) US Size 3 (3.25mm) needles

Size

4" (10cm) in diameter

Gauge

6 sts = 1"

Cast on 10 sts.

Row 1: knit

Row 2: k2, YO, k7, turn. This leaves 1 st on the left needle un-worked. Just leave it. Row 3: knit Row 4: k2, YO, k7, turn. Leaves 2 sts un-worked. Row 5: knit Row 6: k2, YO, k7, turn. Leaves 3 sts un-worked. Row 7: knit Row 8: Bind off 3 sts, k1, YO, k4, turn. Leaves 4 sts un-worked. Row 9: knit Row 10: k2, YO, k4, turn. Leaves 5 sts un-worked. Row 11: knit Row 12: k2, YO, k4, turn. Leaves 6 sts un-worked. Row 13: knit **Row 14:** Bind off 3, k1, yo, k1, turn. Leaves 7 un-worked. Row 15: knit Row 16: k2, YO, k1, turn. Leaves 8 sts un-worked. Row 17: knit Row 18: k2, YO, k1, turn. Leaves 9 sts un-worked. Row 19: knit Row 20: Bind off 3 sts, knit to end of row = 10 sts again

Repeat these 20 rows of pattern 6 more times for a total of 7 "wedges". Bind off. Sew Cast on edge to Bound off edge. Block if possible depending on your choice of yarn.

Hang with a ornament hook or add a ribbon loop for hanging.
