# Agasalhos e Bugalhos yarn creations and designs

#### Little Oak Christmas Ornaments



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**Expert Level:** Advanced Beginner **Approx: Final Measurements of the Booties:** (height x sole): ±7x5cm / 2,75"x2" **Approx: Final Height of the Hat:** ±7,5cm / ±3"

**Tension:** 25 stitches x 34 rows = 10cm / 4" in stocking stitch with 3,5mm (US 4) needles.

Note: The item of this pattern was tested and I did my best to ensure that these instructions are accurate and complete: However I cannot be responsible for variations in individual work, typographical errors, or if the specified ply of yarn recommended for this pattern has not been used. It is very important that you complete a tension square with the yarn and needles of your preference.

#### Materials:

- Yarn: DK weight 100% Merino Wool <u>Merino 4</u>

<u>Us</u> Brand Rosários 4 (±50g/125m/1ball): 1 ball Booties: ±20g / ±50m Hat: ±10g / ±25m

- 3 mm (US 2,5) straight or circular needles
- 3,5mm (US 4) straight or circular needles
- small cable needle (or a double pointed needle)
- tapestry needle
- 2 stitch markers
- scissors
- measuring tape
- pompom maker (optional)

#### Abbreviations:

beg - beginning cm - centimeters g·st - garter stitch (knit every row) in(s) - inch(es) k - knit k2tog - knit 2 stitches together (decrease 1 st) P2tog - Purl 2 stitches together (decrease 1 st) kfb - knit in front and back of stitch p - purl pfb - purl in front and back of stitch pm – place marker psso - pass slip stitch over rs - right side sl - slip a stitch sm - slip marker ssk - slip slip knit (decrease 1 st) st(s) - stitch(es) st st - stocking stitch (k one row, p one row) tog - together ws - wrong side yo - yarn over (makes a new stitch)

If you are knitting this pattern for babies or small children to play with, due to the safety reasons, I strongly advise to NOT USE BUTTONS or any other materials that may be a choking hazard. Please only use safe and good quality materials in order to prevent accidents: BOOTIES Use the 3,5mm / US4 needles

☑ Cast on 18 sts.

 $\Box$ Row 1 (WS): Knit all sts.

□Row 2 (R5): (K1, Kfb1, K5, Kfb1, K1) repeat from (to) one more time. You have 22 sts.

 $\Box$ Row 3 (WS): Knit all sts.

□Row 4 (R5): (K2, Kfb1, K5, Kfb1, K2), repeat from (to) one more time. You have 26 sts.

□Row 5 (WS): Knit all sts.

□Row 6 (R5): K3, Kfb1, K5, Kfb1, K1, Kfb1, K2, Kfb1, K1, Kfb1, K5, Kfb1, K3. You have 32 sts.



□Rows 7 to 15: Knit all sts.

Now we will start decreasing to shape the bootie· Keep a firm tension during these decrease rows·

□Row 16 (R5): K7, (55K) x 4 times, K2, (K2tog) x 4 times , K7· You have 24 sts· □Row 17 (W5): Knit all sts· □Row 18 (R5): K5, (55K) x 3 times, K2, (K2tog) x 3 times, K5. You have 18 sts. □Row 19 (W5): Knit all sts.



□Rows 20 to 35: Knit all sts



(R5): Cast off all sts, using an elastic bind off (see how at the end of the pattern), leaving a long tail to sew the bootie back and sole seam.



□Sew the back of the leg and the sole seam· I recommend using an invisible seam method ("invisible vertical seam on garter stitch" for the leg and "invisible horizontal seam on garter stitch" for the sole), but you can use the method you prefer·





□Repeat all the previous steps for the second bootie and weave all the yarn ends.

 $\Box \mbox{\it To}$  hang the botties, just join some thread on the back of it.

CONGRATULATIONS!! You have just handknitted a lovely pair of booties!

Start with the 3mm / US 2,5 needles ⊠Cast on 42 sts·

 $\Box$ Rows 1, 3, 5, 7 (R5): P2, (K2, P2) repeat until the end of the row

 $\Box$ Rows 2, 4, 6, 8 (WS): K2, (P2, K2) repeat until the end of the row

Place the markers as follow: 14 sts, PM, 14 sts, PM, 14 sts.



#### BODY

Change to the 3,5mm (US4) needles

To make the instructions easier to follow I will restart the row counting for the body of the hat  $\cdot$ 

Row 5 is the cable row, where you will use the cable needle (you can also use a double pointed needle)  $\cdot$ 

 $\square$  Row 1 and 3 (RS): Purl until 1<sup>st</sup> marker, SM, <u>K2, P2, K6, P2, K2</u>, SM, Purl until the end of row.

 $\Box$ Row 2 and 4 (WS): Knit until 1<sup>st</sup> marker, SM, <u>P2, K2, P6, K2, P2</u>, SM, Knit until the end of the row



The next row is the cable row, prepare your cable needle:

### □Row 5 (RS): Purl until 1<sup>st</sup> marker, SM…



...K2, P2, slip the next 3 stitches (without knitting them) to the cable needle and leave it, with those stitches on hold, at the back of work...



....Knit the next 3 stitches...



...now grab the cable needle in your left hand and ...Purl until the end of rowslide the stitches to the needle tip, without twisting them...



...Knit the 3 sts from the cable needle...



····P2, K2, SM···





 $\Box$ Row 6 (WS): Knit until 1<sup>st</sup> marker, SM, <u>P2</u>, <u>K2</u>, <u>P6</u>, <u>K2</u>, <u>P2</u>, SM, Knit until the end of row

 $\Box$ Repeat these last 6 rows one more time.



TOP OF THE HEAD DECREASES Remove the markers □Next Row(R5) : P2, (K2, P2) repeat until the end of the row

 $\Box$ Next Row (WS): K2, (P2, K2) repeat until the end of the row

□Next Row (RS) : P2tog, (K2, P2tog) repeat until the end of the row You have 31 sts



 $\Box$ Next Row (WS): K1, (P2, K1) repeat until the end of the row-

□Next Row (R5): P1, (K2tog, P1) repeat until the end of the row You have 21 sts

□Next Row (WS): K1, (P2tog) repeat until the end of the row You have 11 sts

□Next Row (R5): K1, (K2tog) repeat until the end of the row<sup>.</sup> You have 6sts



□Cut the yarn, leaving a long tail, to sew the back seam, and pass the thread through the remaining sts, with the help of a tapestry needle.



□Sew the back seam· □Weave all the yarn ends· □If you like, you can add a little pompom· □To hang the botties, just join some thread on the back of it· CONGRATULATIONS!! You have just handknitted a beautiful hat!

## SPECIAL STITCHES AND TECHNIQUES

\*\* Lace Bind Off - <u>Elastic Cast Off</u> \*\*
□ (RS) knit 2 sts.
□Insert your left hand needle into the front of those 2 knitted sts.



□Wrap the yarn around the right hand needle and pull it through those 2 sts (it is almost like knitting the second part of a SSK (slip slip knit). And you stay with 1 st on your right hand needle.

 $\Box$ Now knit 1 st. You have again 2 sts on your right hand needle. And repeat the previous steps until the end of the row.
