

# ephemera shawl

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Ephemera is a feminine shawl composed of flouncy ruffles and lighter-than-air fabric. It's soft and warm, making it the perfect item for a wintery outing that requires some elegance.

The triangle shape of this shawl is easy to create and the simple fabric makes it a soothing project. The first ruffle is a continuation of the body of the shawl and the second shorter flounce is picked up and knit afterwards.

This shawl is knit from the tip to the ruffles with a lace weight yarn in four colours. This shawl has one size (easily adjustable).

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## The Technical Stuff

**Skill Level:**

Rookie-**Apprentice**-Virtuoso-Genius

**Skills:** knit, purl, picking up sts

**Sizes:** one size (adjustable)

**Finished Measurements:**

approx 152 cm long measured along the straight edge and 101 cm wide at the bottom lying flat after blocking

**Gauge:** not crucial

approx 25 sts and 34 rows = 10 cm in St st on 4 mm after blocking

**Yarn:** lace weight wool

**Suggested Brands:**

4 x 50 g skeins of soft, lace weight yarn in 4 colours

for specifics, please see notes on next page

**Needles:**

4 mm 80 cm circls

*or size needed to obtain gauge*

**Other Materials:** tapestry needle or teeny crochet hook

**Skill Level:**

Rookie-**Apprentice**-Virtuoso-Genius

**Skills:** knit, purl, picking up sts

**Sizes:** one size (adjustable)

**Finished Measurements:**

approx 60" long measured along the straight edge and 40" wide at the bottom lying flat after blocking

**Gauge:** not crucial

approx 25 sts and 34 rows = 4" in St st on US 6 after blocking

**Yarn:** lace weight wool

**Suggested Brands:**

4 x 1.7 oz skeins of soft, lace weight yarn in 4 colors

for specifics, please see notes on next page

**Needles:**

US 6 32" circls

*or size needed to obtain gauge*

**Other Materials:** tapestry needle or teeny crochet hook



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## Notes on Yarns Used:

**Colour A** = 1 skein Malabrigo *Lace* merino wool (56 Olive, dark green); 470 yds / 430 m

**Colour B** = 1 skein Habu Textiles A-1 2/17 *Tsugumi Silk* (color 40, light green); 450 yds / 411 m (per 48 g)

**Colour C** = 1 skein Helen Hamann *Deliverance* alpaca (pottery red); 437 yds / 400 m

**Colour D** = 1 cone Habu Textiles *Super Fine Merino* merino wool (pink); 747 yds / 68 m (per 28 g)

## Instructions:

Beginning at tip CO 3 sts with colour A.

Work back and forth. 1 st increased every other row.

**Set-Up:** Knit 2 rows.

**Row 1:** Kfb, knit to end. 1 st increased.

**Row 2:** Knit.

Rep Rows 1 and 2 twice more. 6 sts.

Attach Colour B (do not cut A).

**Row 3 (RS):** K2, Kfb, knit to end. 1 st increased.

**Row 4 (WS):** K3, purl to last 3 sts, K3.

Change to Colour A and rep Rows 3 and 4.

Continue working Rows 3 and 4, alternating Colour A and B every 2 rows until you run out of yarn ending with a WS row.

Cut A and B. Attach Colour C.

With RS facing, Kfb in every st across. The number of sts doubles.

Work in St st (knit all sts on the RS and purl all sts on the WS) for 11 cm / 4.5" (or to desired length of ruffle) ending with a WS row (no increases at edges).

With RS facing, BO loosely kwise.

**Double ruffle (optional):**

With RS facing, in the third row above where your first ruffle begins insert needle into every other leg of each st across (picking up 1 st / 1 st).

With WS facing, attach Colour D.

**Row 1:** Ptbl in each st.

**Row 2:** Kfb in each st. The number of sts doubles.

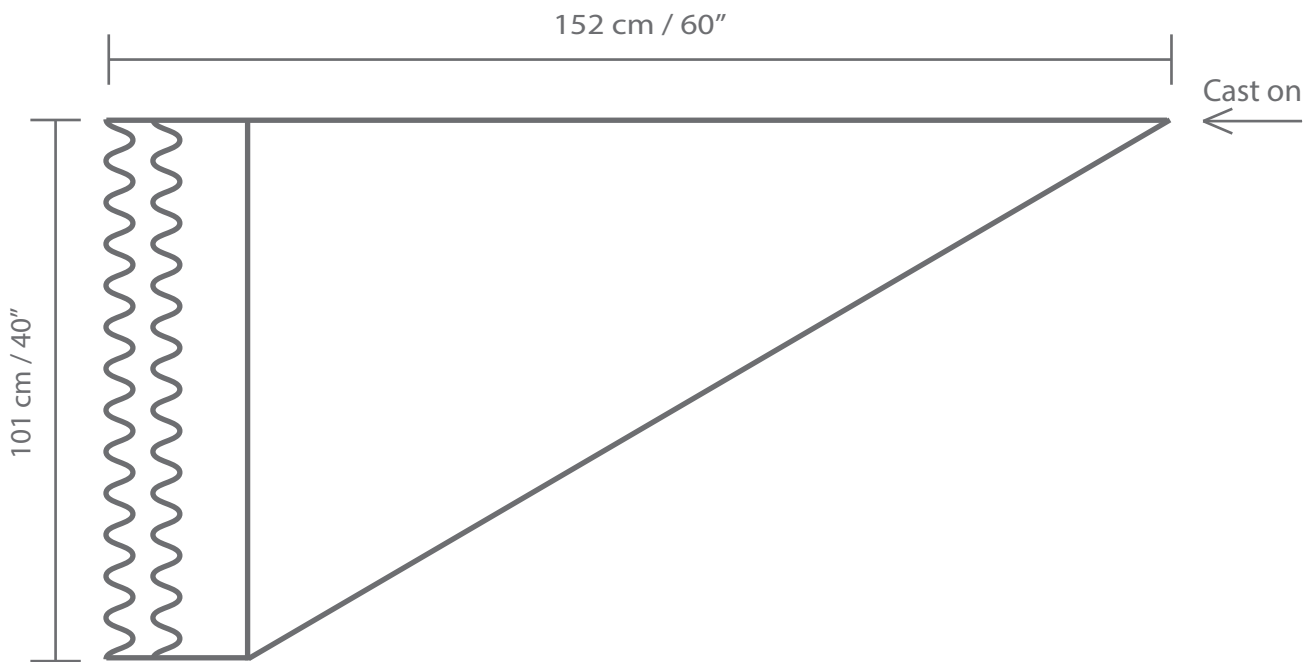
Work in St st (as for first ruffle) for 10 cm / 4" ending with a WS row. With RS facing, BO loosely kwise.

Cut yarn and weave in ends. Block this shawl by soaking it in warm water for a few hours and laying it flat to dry.

**BO** = bind off

**BOR** = beginning of round

**CC** = contrasting colour

**ch** = chain

**circ(s)** = circular needle(s)

**cn** = cable needle

**CO** = cast on

**cont** = continue

**dc** = double crochet

**dpn(s)** = double pointed needle(s)

**dec(s)** = decrease(s)

**fol** = follow(ing)

**hdc** = half-double crochet

**hk** = hook

**inc** = increase

**incl** = including

**K** = knit

**K2tog** = knit two stitches together (decrease)

**Kfb** = knit into front and back of stitch (increase)

**Ktbl** = knit through back loop

**kwise** = knitwise

**lp(s)** = loop(s)

**m** = marker

**M1** = make one (increase)

**M1L** = left slanting increase

**M1R** = right slanting increase

**MC** = main colour

**P** = purl

**P2tog** = purl two stitches together (decrease)

**patt** = pattern

**pm** = place marker

**prev** = previous

**psso** = passover

**pu** = pick up

**pwise** = purlwise

**rem** = remaining

**rep** = repeat

**rev St st** = reverse stockinette stitch

**rnd(s)** = round(s)

**RS** = right side

**sc** = single crochet

**sk** = skip

**skp** = slip one stitch, knit one stitch, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch (decrease)

**sl** = slip

**sl1k** = slip one stitch knitwise

**sl1p** = slip one stitch purlwise

**sl m** = slip marker

**sp(s)** = space(s)

**ssk** = slip, slip, knit two slipped stitches together (decrease)

**sssk** = slip, slip, slip, knit all slipped stitches together (double decrease)

**st(s)** = stitche(s)

**St st** = stockinette stitch / stocking stitch

**tbl** = through back loops

**tog** = together

**WS** = wrong side

**wyib** = with yarn in back

**wyif** = with yarn in front

**YO** = yarn over
